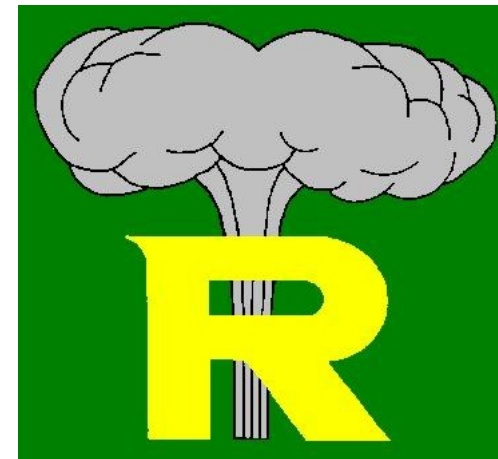


And, most importantly...
